

The online event of Inter house ‘ACT TO REACT’ competition commenced with a prayer.


With such a splendid performance by all the houses, it was very difficult for the judge of the event Ms. Vandana Choubey to decide who would win.


The first position was grabbed by Siddhant House followed by Vishwas House at second place and Shakti House at third place.

The students of Grade 6 under the Literary Fest activity -a part of the EBSB Programme were challenged to test their knowledge with the interesting online quiz on Meghalaya-the paired state with Uttar Pradesh.</p> <p>The quiz was conducted on 17th November. The students of Grade 7 participated in “Kala Sanyojan” the dance competition - which was a fusion of Meghalaya & Arunachal Pradesh folk dance united with Uttar Pradesh dance styles. Students performed on various Folk songs of Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh.</p>
