- 1 Everyone is fascinated by identical twins: they look the same – even advanced digital imaging systems sometimes fail to tell them apart – and yet they have different personalities and abilities. They may have the same eyes, the same hair colour, and the same smile, but one will be shy and the other more outgoing, or one cleverer or funnier or kinder than the other and this is despite them having the same DNA. They do not, however, have the same fingerprints, which are believed to be determined by environmental factors.
- 2 Twins like spending time with each other – often to the exclusion of others. In fifty per cent of cases, they even develop their own secret language. Furthermore, it is commonly believed that they have the ability to communicate telepathically so that, for instance, one is able to draw a picture of what the other is thinking. There have been innumerable claims that a twin has shared the physical or mental pain of the other – known as ‘crisis telepathy’ – even when they could not have known it was happening.
- 3 Monozygotic twins – who share everything before birth – usually share everything after birth too: the same tastes in food, music, sport or politics ... One might think that this could be explained by the fact that parents often give their new-born twins confusingly similar names, continue to dress them exactly alike until they are well into their teens, and generally treat them in the same way throughout their upbringing. However, there are well-documented cases of identical twins brought up separately from birth who nonetheless made the same decisions and life choices.
- 4 In August every year, thousands of twins descend on a town in Ohio called Twinsburg, named by identical twin brothers nearly two centuries ago. The Twins Day Festival is a three-day event

consisting of talent shows and look-alike contests that has become one of the world's largest gatherings of twins.

- 5 Scientists study twins to collect evidence for the age-old nature versus nurture debate: how much of their behaviour is hereditary and how much is conditioned by their environment; what are people actually born with and what is caused by experience? Because identical twins come from a single fertilized egg that splits into two and shares virtually the same genetic code, any differences between them must be due to environmental factors. Studying the differences between identical twins to pinpoint the influence of environment, and comparing identical twins with fraternal ones to measure the role of inheritance, has been crucial in understanding the interplay of nature and nurture in determining our personalities, behaviour, and vulnerability to disease.

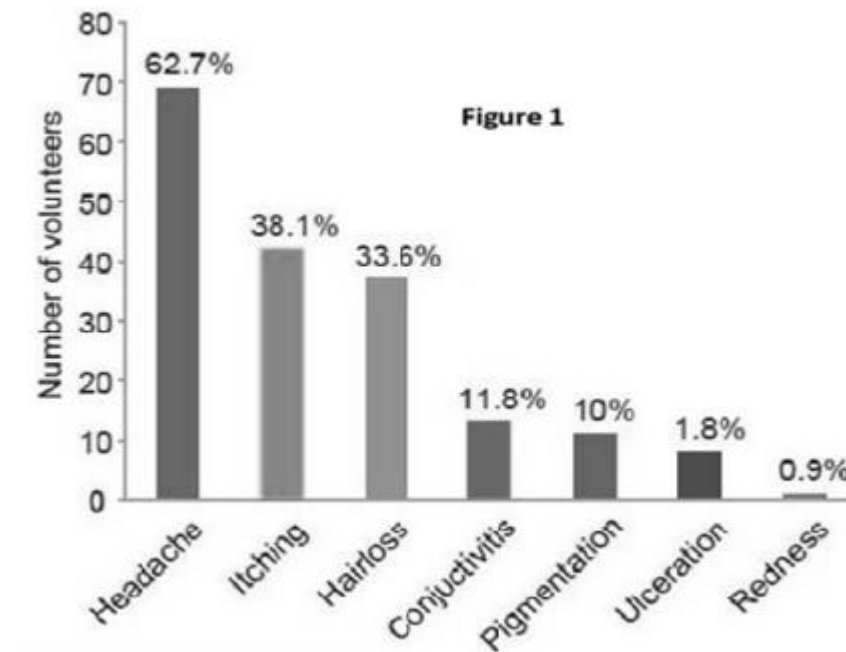

II Read the passage given below: 08

- 1 The coloring of hair signifies a major step in self-innovative science. Owing to increased demand, the market is poised for new scientific breakthroughs to produce quick and efficient hair colouring products. Among both genders, millions use it today. Colouring of the hair is performed not only by professionals but is also a popular cosmetic procedure at home. Earlier natural hair dyes were used but now, synthetic dyes are a popular choice.
- 2 A study was conducted to assess the knowledge, practice, perception and adverse reactions among the hair dye users. A questionnaire about the use of hair dyes and its reactions was administered randomly among a total of 263 volunteers, of which 52.5% and 47.5% were females and males respectively in the age group 18-60 years.
- 3 The results revealed that synthetic dyes were used by 91% and for 51%, the frequency of use was 2-5 times annually. However, a majority (86%) of the responders used hair dye 3-5 times a year only to colour their grey hair. A very small percentage of students (4 %) used exotic colours to look fashionable. A total of 110 volunteers had adverse reactions. Of these, 67% had suffered from reactions within 1 hour of using hair dye compared to 33% who had reactions after 24 hours.
- 4 The overall study results suggest that most people who use hair dyes have insufficient knowledge of hair dye products and should be encouraged to use natural products, which have fewer side effects.

The researchers were unanimous in the opinion that while they understood the cosmetic appeal of hair colouring, the fact that it can lead to long-term problems should not be ignored.

III NOTE MAKING & SUMMARIZING 08

Read the passage below:

It is an unpretentious structure tucked in a corner of Chandni Chowk. It could be missed by a passer-by but for the chirping, which gives away its unique mission. The Charity Birds Hospital is the only one of its kind in the country. Many people arrive here daily with injured birds which they may have found lying by the roadside. After a quick inspection, an attendant makes a simple entry in the register; name of the person, kind of bird, and date, and “admits the patient” for treatment, free of cost. The bird then becomes the sole responsibility of the hospital.

The ailing bird is administered first-aid and then kept in an isolated cage. Often medication and proper care are all that is needed. After the wound heals, the bird is moved to a common section with other birds of its kind. Soon it becomes healthy enough to fly away. The work began way back in 1929 in a small, one-room structure. A few years later it became increasingly difficult to treat the large number of birds being brought. Later, in 1957, the present building was inaugurated.

The progress of the hospital has been slow but steady. Initially, only Ayurvedic treatment was administered. Allopathy was adopted later in 1968. It was as recent as 1992 that a laboratory was set up to conduct pathological tests. Though surgery is also conducted at times and doctors try their best to save the bird’s life, it is often too late. The mortality rate is quite high: around five to six birds die every day. The hospital survives only on charity.

The trustees proudly claim that there is a steady flow of donations. To date, they have never approached the government for funds.
