The Seven Wonders of the World

- (1) There are different categories of the 'Wonders of the World' including Ancient, Natural and Modern, and the New Seven Wonders of the World. On the 7th of July 2007 in Lisbon, Portugal, the list of the new Seven Wonders of the World was published. Twenty-five finalists were chosen and the public from all around the world chose their favourites. Some of the most well-known ones are discussed further.
- (2) The Great Wall of China is a series of walls and fortifications that was built over 500 years ago in northern China. It was built to prevent China from invasion and protect trade routes. Due to natural erosion and human interference, 30% of the Great Wall has disappeared or been destroyed. Christ the Redeemer statue is in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The statue stands 30 meters tall and its arms span 28 meters wide. It is a symbol of Christianity that attracts millions of visitors every year.
- (3) Built on a mountain ridge in Peru, Machu Pichu is believed to be either a royal estate or a ceremonial city. Machu Pichu appeals to many different people and is often voted as one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world. New rules have been brought in recently to protect the ruins from further damage caused by mass tourism.
- (4) The Taj Mahal was built in Agra on the orders of emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his favourite wife. It is built on the bank of the Yamuna River out of white marble. Not only, it is one of the most beautiful buildings of the modern world, but also it attracts a large number of tourists. Sadly, the rising pollution levels have been tarnishing the natural white colour of the marbles.
- (5) Such popular tourist spots can neither escape natural damage, nor human interference. However, if we want to celebrate these places for many more years to come, then we must realise our responsibility towards conserving them.
